NIXON WAS PRESIDENT

With just enough capital to buy two roll mills and a mixer, Deco-Chem began manufacturing high quality inks for a few appliance and automotive trim customers. That all happened in a drafty building in downtown Mishawaka that was soon to be condemned. By the time Ronald Regan had taken the oath of office, Deco-Chem had expanded its product mix and moved to a new building in a new industrial area. It was the year of the first space shuttle flight and the first woman was elected to the supreme court.
